- PAI stands for Pierce Academic Institute
- The institute is a school within a school, with challenging classes for high-performing students

# How do I get started if I'm interested?

- All students who want to be a part of PAI must apply for the program at Pierce Middle School, and their academic and behavioral performance must meet the established requirements
- Applications are available in the Pierce Counseling Office and on the website
- Applications include an information form, teacher referral, and a written student statement of intent
- Once the application is complete, the student will be contacted to set up a time for testing, if the student does not currently have STAR Math and Reading scores

- Students who will be enrolled in the 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, or 8<sup>th</sup> grade

# How many students are in the PAI?

- Approximately 90 PAI students will be enrolled during the 2015-2016 school year
- 30 students per grade 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup>

# When is the application due?

- Thursday, May 7, 2015 by 4:00 p.m.
- Parents or students must turn in both the Student Application Form and the signed PAI FAQs to the counseling office at Pierce Middle School
- Teacher recommendations need to be turned in directly to the Pierce Counseling Office by May
   11<sup>th</sup>, so be sure to give them plenty of time
- Students who miss the deadline may submit an application, but enrollment in the PAI will occur only after those on the waitlist have been considered

# How are students selected once the application is turned in?

- Students are ranked based on a number of assessments, including the State assessment, STAR Math, STAR Reading and grade point averages
- Incoming 6<sup>th</sup> graders will need to schedule a day to take the STAR Math and Reading tests at Pierce Middle School several dates are available (4/27, 5/2, 5/6 and 5/12)
- Based on these scores and teacher recommendations, students are ranked and the top 30 students in each grade are considered for the PAI
- A waitlist is established for students who qualify academically

# When can my child take the Star Math and Reading tests?

- Current Pierce students will take the Star Math and Reading tests during school in May and will
  not need to arrange any additional testing
- Future Pierce students can take the test on any of the following dates:
  - Monday, April 27 @ 4:00 p.m.
  - Saturday, May 2 @ 10:00 a.m.

- Wednesday, May 6 @ 4:00 p.m.
- Tuesday, May 12 @ 4:00 p.m.
- The Pierce counseling office will contact you once your application is received and set up a testing date
- Testing will take approximately 1 1 ½ hours, although times vary from student to student
- Testing is done online and students may use pencil and paper on the math portion

# How and when are students moved from the waitlist to the PAI?

- Students on the waitlist are selected in order when an opening is available
- Parents are notified and consulted when an opening is available
- After updated Star scores have been received and/or student GPAs have been updated, students on the waiting list are selected based on their updated assessments and GPA, rather than the assessments and GPA from the previous spring

# What are the "more rigorous academic requirements" that PAI students must meet?

All PAI students...

- Must keep up with the rigorous academic requirements
- PAI students will have required summer assignments in Language Arts, Science, Math, and Social Studies in order to prepare students for the coming year
- Summer assignments are turned in and graded when school begins
- Eighth grade students will be enrolled in Algebra I and English 9 (these are high school courses and students will earn high school credits)
- PAI students often have more homework in math, read more books, and perform at a higher level in all core subjects
- Must complete a minimum of 5 hours of community service at Pierce Middle School during the school year, such as tutoring, office helper, Media Center aide, teacher helper, etc.
- PAI students who are also NJHS members will complete a total of 15 hours, 5 of which will be at Pierce and will satisfy the PAI community service requirement

# What happens if a PAI student doesn't do well under the "more rigorous academic requirements" that PAI students must meet?

- If a student has an quarterly GPA of below a 3.0, they and their parents will receive a probation letter telling them that the student is on immediate academic probation
- Once on academic probation, they will have one more reporting period to meet the 3.0 quarterly GPA and overall GPA standard
- Students showing exceptional improvement but not meeting the required GPA standards for a second time may be considered for the PAI PASS program [Positive Academic Support System]
- The PAI PASS program requires students to attend PAI homework clinics twice per week in order to receive additional and individual support
- Struggling students are also encouraged to come up with a plan for how they may become more successful
- Pierce also offers Honors classes in all grades for Language Arts and Math, for students who excel in those subjects but are not in the PAI

# What if a PAI student has behavior problems?

- All PAI students must comply with the Pierce behavior policy
- Suspensions and failure to comply with behavioral expectations can alone be grounds for removal

- Students who have behavioral infractions will be put on behavioral probation
- Additional infractions while on probation may result in removal from the PAI
